WHAT IS NET ZERO?

Net Zero means any emissions created are offset by schemes to the equivalent amount of greenhouse gasses in the atmosphere.

WHY DOES IT MATTER TO YOUR BUSINESS?



Climate change matters to customers, in a recent survey by *revolt Top 50 where do they care?* Environmentally aware consumers are consciously buying greener locally sourced products. Consumers believe businesses have a key role to play in reaching Net Zero targets, with **73**% of millennials surveyed stating government aren't able to achieve climate challenges alone.

It is law! In April 2021 The UK Government announced the sixth Carbon Budget, the carbon reduction target of **78%** by 2035 from 1990s levels is now law. Legislation for larger businesses will put pressure on smaller business to be greener and more sustainable.









WHAT CAN YOUR BUSINESS DO?

All positive climate action matters, whether this is incremental changes, an overhaul of your business strategy or pivoting into new opportunities. Below are some key points for businesses to help achieve the global Net Zero targets.

MAKE A COMMITMENT TO CHANGE

The Greenhouse Gas Protocol Corporate Standard (GHG Protocol) is a universal standard of frameworks used to measure and manage greenhouse gas emissions from industry. They have outlined 3 Scopes of greenhouse gas emissions that your business is responsible for:

- Scope 1 are emissions from direct and controlled sources for example your business premises
- Scope 2 emissions from indirect sources for example your energy supplier
- Scope 3 all other indirect emissions from your supply chain

IMPORTANT CONSIDERATIONS

Planning; so many companies will commit without knowing how they will achieve targets that fall into the above scopes. It is important to baseline your current emissions and have a plan of action. The carbon trust have an online tool to measure your businesses Carbon Footprint.


